REFERENCE BOOKS

The American Presidents -- REF E176.1 .A6566 Includes signed essays on the American presidents as well as various charts and tables.

Chronology of Women's History -- REF HQ1121 .O47 1994 Covers the landmarks of women's history from Prehistory to 1993.

Encyclopedia of African-American Culture and History -- REF E185 .E54 1996

An exhaustive multi-volume source that includes thematic essays, topical entries, and biographical sketches. Essays are signed and include bibliographies.

Encyclopedia of European Social History from 1350 to 2000 – REF HN373 .E63 2001

Contains more than 20,000 signed entries covering prehistory to the year 2000.

Encyclopedia of Modern Middle East & North Africa – REF DS43 .E53 2004 Offers coverage of Middle East's modern history by scholars in areas including political science, religion and anthropology.

Encyclopedia of New York State – REF F119 .E53 2005 Contains information about the history, culture, politics, sports, geography, industry, agriculture and people of New York State.

Encyclopedia of Twentieth-Century African History – REF DT29 .E53 2003 Focuses on the history of Africa throughout the 20th century.

Facts about the World's Nations -- REF D421 .F33 1999 Includes historical information as well as current data on the world's nations.

Handbook to Life in Ancient Egypt – REF DT83 .D23 2003 Discusses the latest findings in areas of Egyptology, including the results of the latest excavations and techniques involved in new scientific studies.

Handbook to Life in Ancient Mesopotamia – REF DS69.5 .B47 2003 Explores the culture of the great civilizations of ancient Mesopotamia which gave rise to literature, art, government, and urban life.

Handbook to Life in Ancient Rome – REF DG77 .A35 Provides in-depth, easy-to-understand information on all areas of Roman life, moving from the eighth century B.C. to the fifth century A.D.

Oxford Companion to United States History -- REF E174 .O94 2001 A one-volume encyclopedic collection of signed essays on various facets of American history.
