***ABA LSAC Official Guide to ABA-Approved Law Schools* – REF KF 273 .A87 2006** The most comprehensive law school preparation guide.

***Barron's How to Prepare for the LSAT (Law School Admission Test)* – REF KF 285 .Z9B3 2002** The best preparation source for the LSAT includes six full-length model exams with complete explanations, special preparation assistance, and study tips (with a guided 5 week study plan).

***Black's Law Dictionary* – REF KF 156 .B53 1999** Contains over 20,000 alphabetized entries covering every important legal term and including see references and cross references.

***Business Law* – REF KF888.5554 2006** Designed for use in Business Law and Legal Environment courses. Each chapter contains narrative text, cases on business, commerce, securities transactions, banking regulations and more.

***Constitutional Law* – REF KF 4549 .C647 2001** The classic text for constitutional law, divided by government branches and topically. Includes biographical notes on Supreme Court Justices and a section on the Supreme Court since 1789.

***Contracts* – REF KF 801 .F365 2004** The preeminent guide to contract law and business contracts for commercial and private use.

***Health Law Handbook* – REF KF 3825 .H43** National experts write on legal developments in the health care field. Updated annually.

***Landmark Supreme Court Cases* – REF KF 8742 .H37 2004** Summarizes some of the most important Supreme Court cases with entries providing discussion of key issues, history of the case, summary or arguments, the ruling, and the aftermath.

***Rudden and Wyatt's EU Treaties and Legislation* – REF KJE 916 .B374 2004** Provides a collection of the European Union treaties and legislation as well as information on the European Union's constitution, competition, and merger regulation.

***Smith and Roberson's Business Law* – REF KF 888 .S554 2006** Designed for use in Business Law and Legal Environment courses. Each chapter contains narrative text, cases on business, commerce, securities transactions, banking regulations and more.

West's Encyclopedia of American Law (WEAL) – REF KF 154 .W47 2005 13 volumes. The first ten volumes contain legal terms, forms, significant cases, topical, and biographical articles. Volume 11 covers appellate briefs and landmark Supreme Court decisions. Volume 12 is a collection of primary legal documents from English and American legal history. Volume 13 is a dictionary and indexes.
